

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, John A. Duncan, Superintendent of the Department of Liquor Licenses and Control has advised the Tribe that he will not issue any Arizona spirituous liquor licenses unless he is assured that the Arizona State Liquor Laws will be enforced on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and


WHEREAS, the said Superintendent of the Department of Liquor Licenses and Control has criminal and civil jurisdiction over non-members of the Tribe both within and without the exterior boundaries of the Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe desires to cooperate to the fullest extent with the Arizona State Department of Liquor Licenses and Control in the administration of Liquor Laws on the Reservation.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Area Director is requested to issue to John A. Duncan, Superintendent of the Department of Liquor Licenses and Control for the State of Arizona and to each of his designated Law Enforcement Agents or Deputies, a Deputy Special Officers commission.

The foregoing Resolution was on April 8, 1958 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (a) and (g) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
