


RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the cost of maintaining facilities for the use of fishermen and of assisting in the stocking of streams and of miscellaneous administrative services have increased greatly in recent years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Resolution No. 52-15 adopted by the Council on April 14, 1952 be amended as follows: Resident fishing permits shall be available to any person who has been a resident of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for at least three months prior to date of application. The cost of these permits shall be \$10.00 per year or any part thereof.

The foregoing resolution was on June 2, 1958 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (p) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Barry DeRose who has been Tribal Attorney the past two years for the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to express the appreciation of the White Mountain Apache people for the excellent legal and other valuable services he has rendered them and also desires to indicate the respect which he has inspired among them.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that we do hereby extend to Barry DeRose a permit to hunt and fish within the confines of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation with the same seasonal duration, as well as bag and catch limits as are granted to regular tribal members.
