

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona (Highway Department) desires to obtain screenings for the purpose of highway maintenance in the Show Low, Arizona district, and

WHEREAS, materials desired by the State of Arizona Highway Department are located within the boundaries of the reservation as shown by State Highway Department map dated April 4, 1951 containing 14 acres more or less and said State Highway Department has agreed to pay for materials removed from the designated area at the rate of four cents (.04) per ton for screenings, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is willing to cooperate with the said request of the State of Arizona Highway Department and receive a fair price for the required materials.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the State Highway Department be granted a permit to remove approximately 2,000 tons of screenings at .04 per ton beginning September 24, 1958 and ending September 24, 1959.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Tribal Council be instructed to sign and the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona is requested to consummate necessary permit for the removal of above materials in accordance with provisions of Title 25 CFR, as amended, and in compliance with provisions contained herewith.

The foregoing resolution was on September 24, 1958 duly adopted by a vote of 11 for and 10 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
