

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Diamond Creek Spruce-Fir Logging Unit was authorized July 11, 1957 by the Area Director for the cutting of two million board feet of timber annually by the Fort Apache Wholesale Lumber Company, and

WHEREAS, the Rock Mountain Forest and Range Experiment Station Paper No. 39 reports increased insect damage in the southwest including the Fort Apache Reservation, it is advisable and agreed to by the Area Forester that an increased rate of cut be made on this logging unit.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the cutting rate on the Diamond Creek Spruce-Fir Logging Unit be increased to four million board feet per year for the duration of this unit.

The foregoing resolution was on March 4, 1959 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
