

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is interested in further range improvements on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the plans have been prepared for a complete range improvement program on the Cibecue Creek Drainage, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council have approved these plans, and

WHEREAS, the U. S. Geological Survey, U. S. Department of the Interior, has requested permission to install water gauging stations to study the effects of the treatment on the Cibecue Creek.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the following gauging stations be hereby approved:

1. White Springs.
2. Cibecue Creek below Cibecue Spring.
3. Upper Cibecue Creek above Farmer's Diversion.
4. Mouth of Cibecue Creek near junction with Salt River.

The foregoing Resolution was on April 29, 1959 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) and (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
