

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Resolution No. 59-21

WHEREAS, the Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc., of Lakeside, Arizona has requested an easement to construct an electric power line of certain areas of the reservation, and

WHEREAS, the tribe will be benefited by electricity being furnished to new areas,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary be authorized to execute an easement to the Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. to construct an electric power line over and across the Rim Road and Wagon Wheel Ranch Road to Corduroy Canyon including extension to Forestdale - 10.742 miles.

From Corduroy Canyon to Carrizo Area including Carrizo Distribution - 11.628 miles.

Cedar Creek Line from Junction of U. S. Highway 60 and Whiteriver Road to Cedar Creek Area - 11.773 miles.

Carrizo Area to Cibecue Area - upper and lower reaches - and including extension to Highway 60 and Cibecue Road Junction. - 17.541 miles.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if and when said Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. fails to use said area for an electric power line that this easement shall terminate and all improvements attached to the realty shall revert to the tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on April 29, 1959 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a), (b) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
