

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has a big game management plan in effect, and

WHEREAS, the increment in the reservation elk here was in excess of the kill for the past year, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to manage the reservation elk herd and keep its numbers limited to the available range, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to cooperate with the State of Arizona in giving the sportsmen the privilege of hunting elk on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation during the State Season and in compliance with State Laws and regulations.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Arizona Game and Fish Commission be authorized to issue four hundred (400) permits for the taking of ANY ELK from the Fort Apache Indian Reservation during the 1959 season which shall be concurrent with the State Season.

The foregoing resolution was on April 30, 1959 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b), (h), (f) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
