

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN AGENCY

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe supports a credit program from appropriated tribal funds, and
- WHEREAS, the Branch of Credit conducts training for individual Indian members in business and banking practices and assists members in securing individual loans from non-Government lenders, and
- WHEREAS, the Branch of Credit supervises the preparation of tribal budgets, reviews operating statements, balance sheets, operating budgets, programs and books of all tribal enterprises, and
- WHEREAS, tribally owned enterprises are rapidly expanding requiring the Credit Officer to devote considerable time to conferences with enterprise managers and their Board of Directors, and
- WHEREAS, the program has expanded to a point where a position of Clerk-Stenographer in the Branch of Credit is essential, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a position of Clerk-Stenographer, Grade GS-4, be established and that the position be filled from existing Bureau of Indian Affairs personnel or from a register of Civil Service eligibles.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the salary and expenses of this position be paid from appropriated tribal funds not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for the remainder of Fiscal Year 1959 and Fiscal Year 1960 and for each succeeding year an amount sufficient to pay the salary and expenses of the position.

The foregoing resolution was on May 1, 1959 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
