

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe realize that a training program is essential in advancing the job opportunities of its tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, it is the desire of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to make this training program available to its members, and
- WHEREAS, adequate funds were appropriated by the Tribal Council to support certain training programs, and
- WHEREAS, it will benefit the White Mountain Apache Tribe to promote a training program that will further prepare them to assume the responsibility in managing their own affairs.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that training programs be established as follows:

- I. A position of Engineering Aid under a training program as prepared by the Agricultural Engineer and approved by the Land Operations Officer, and
- II. A position of Range Aid under a training program as prepared by the Range Conservationist and approved by the Land Operations Officer.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that both of these positions are to be initially established with a grade of GS-2 and upon the satisfactory completion of one (1) year's training, it will be advanced to a GS-3; and upon the satisfactory completion of one (1) year's training at this level, will automatically become a GS-4.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the pay rate and leave privileges of these positions be equivalent and kept current to the General Schedule rating in the Federal Service.

The foregoing resolution was on July 1, 1959 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
