

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the National Parks Service is in the process of taking over the maintenance and preservation of the Kinishba Ruins on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, it would be to the benefit of the tribe and the general public that the National Parks Service assume the responsibility.


BE IT RESOLVED that the tribe make available approximately fifty-one (51) acres of land to the National Parks Service for the maximum legal allowable period of time said area to be surveyed and to be in the vicinity of the present Kinishba Ruins on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the necessary easements and right-of-ways for ingress to and egress from the said area be granted to said National Parks Service.

The foregoing resolution was on August 5, 1959 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b), (g), (i) and (m) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
