

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 54-9 passed on March 1, 1954 authorized the Chairman and Secretary of the Tribal Council to enter into a modification agreement with the Southwest Lumber Mills, Inc., covering the Maverick Logging Unit Contract, and

WHEREAS, said Chairman and Secretary did on or about the 16th day of March, 1954 entered into a modification of said contract among other things providing that "in no event" shall the total cut exceed 300,000,000 feet board measure for the fifteen-year period ending March 31, 1959, and

WHEREAS, the contractor cut only 285,171,770 board feet, and

WHEREAS, sound forest management practices requires that the stipulated cutting rate be maintained.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Branch of Forestry make an additional necessary modification to increase the cutting rate on the Maverick Logging Unit to conform to the original cutting plans, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary sign said modification plan to be approved by the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Secretary of the Interior, with the said Southwest Lumber Mills, Inc., the purchaser.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all other conditions and stipulations in the previous contract and modification thereof remain in full force and effect.

The foregoing resolution was on August 5, 1959 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a), (b) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
