

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints has applied for a permit to use a tract of tribal land in the Cibecue District for mission purposes, and

WHEREAS, the people in the community had indicated of their desire to have the tribal council approve the request.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency is hereby authorized and requested to issue a revocable permit authorizing the mission to use the following described tribal land in the Cibecue district for mission purposes:

Approximately one acre of ground located 355.45 feet from the Zack Taylay house located in Cibecue, Navajo County, Arizona, in a southwesterly direction.

The foregoing resolution was on December 16, 1959 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
