

Resolution No. 61-1

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona or Highway Department desires to obtain sand and gravel for the purpose of highway maintenance and construction Salt River Becker Butte Highway Project, and

WHEREAS, it is economically beneficial to the tribe to sell said sand and gravel.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Arizona State Highway Department be granted a permit to remove sand and gravel from a material site lying within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, one-half mile left of Station 397 on the Globe-Showlow Highway, Gila County, and being more particularly described in the sand and gravel permit dated the first day of December, 1960 by and between the Tribal Council, Permitter and the Arizona Highway Department, a copy of which is on file in the Superintendent's office, Fort Apache Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman be authorized to sign said contract for and on behalf of the Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on January 4, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
