

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED that the timber on the proposed Sand Creek Road right of way between Hawley Lake and Highway 73 be advertised in accordance with regulations and that the Chairman and Secretary be authorized to sign a contract with the successful bidder.

The foregoing resolution was on February 1, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Dear Mr. Haverland:

Resolution No. 61-10 resolves that the timber on the right of way of the proposed Sand Creek Road be advertised in accordance with regulations and that the Chairman and Secretary be authorized to sign for and on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe. The right of way from Highway 73 to Smith Park recreational area traverses virgin timber and it is proposed that this timber be sold and removed prior to letting a contract for the building of this road.

Resolution No. 61-10 was enacted on February 1, 1961 by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Tribe's Constitution. This authority does not require the review or approval of the Secretary of the Interior.
