

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council by Resolution No. ⁵⁶ 61-2 dated January 23, 1956 recommended that the position of General Livestock Manager of the White Mountain Apache Tribe be filled on February 1, 1956 by one Marion D. Linn, and

WHEREAS, said resolution did not provide for any specified length of time that the contract of employment was to be in effect, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that it is for the best interest and welfare of the tribe that the said Marion D. Linn's position as General Livestock Manager be terminated.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is authorized and directed to notify the said Marion D. Linn that his employment as General Livestock Manager of the White Mountain Apache Tribe be terminated thirty days from the receipt of the notice thereof.

The foregoing resolution was on February 1, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 2 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Dear Mr. Haverland:

Resolution No. 61-12 authorizes and directs the Tribal Council Chairman to notify Marion D. Linn that his employment as General Livestock Manager for the White Mountain Apache Tribe will be terminated within thirty days from receipt of said notice. Mr. Linn was employed February 1, 1956 as General Livestock Manager for the Tribe, however, a formal contract of employment was never executed.

Resolution No. 61-12 was enacted February 1, 1961 by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Tribe's Constitution. Under this authority the resolution does not require review or approval by the Secretary of the Interior.
