

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Tonto Lake received considerable adverse publicity as the result of a severe fish kill in late 1960, and

WHEREAS, the lake has now been re-stocked and will be re-opened to fishing in May of 1961, and

WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Rod and Gun Club desires to conduct a FISH DERBY on the opening day, and

WHEREAS, the proposed DERBY will result in beneficial advertising for this important fishery.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Fort Apache Rod and Gun Club be permitted to conduct a FISH DERBY at Tonto Lake under the supervision of the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise.

The foregoing resolution was on March 1, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Dear Mr. Haverland:

Resolution No. 61-18 employs Hal Butler as Sales Manager for the Fort Apache Wholesale Lumber Company. This resolution resolves that the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe be authorized and directed to execute for and on behalf of the Tribe a contract for employment of a sales manager for the Fort Apache Wholesale Lumber Company. The effective date of the employment of Mr. Butler as Sales Manager is the 1st day of March, 1961.

The resolution was adopted March 1, 1961 by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Tribe's Constitution. Under Section 1 (b) the Tribal Council has authority to negotiate, make and perform contracts and agreements of every description, not inconsistent with law or their Constitution. As this resolution is not inconsistent with law or the Tribe's Constitution, it is not subject to review or approval by the Secretary of the Interior.
