


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the United States Public Health Service has recommended that certain water and sanitation facilities be constructed in the Cibecue and Carrizo areas, and

WHEREAS, the said Public Health Service has offered to construct said facilities and pay therefor 90% of the cost of construction, provided the Tribe assumes and agrees to pay 10% of the cost of construction, not to exceed \$7,100.00, and to furnish labor therefor,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council is hereby authorized and directed to execute for and on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe a contract with the United States Public Health Service providing for the construction of water and sewerage facilities in the Cibecue and Carrizo areas and pledging ten (10%) per cent of the cost of the construction of said facilities, not to exceed \$7,100.00, and further agreeing to furnish labor when available and qualified.

The foregoing resolution was on March 1, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) and (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Dear Mr. Haverland:

Representatives of the U. S. Public Health Service and the Tribal Council have had several discussions regarding the need for domestic water systems in the Cibecue, Carrizo and East Fork communities. It has been decided the first projects will be in Cibecue and Carrizo, and when additional funds become available construction will begin in the East Fork area.

The Public Health Service has offered to construct water and sewerage systems and pay ninety percent of the construction costs, provided the Tribe agrees to pay ten percent of the costs. It is estimated the Cibecue and Carrizo projects will cost approximately \$71,000, therefore, the cost to the Tribe would be \$7,100.

Resolution No. 61-21 authorizes the Tribal Chairman to execute a contract with the Public Health Service for the construction of water and sewerage facilities in the Cibecue and Carrizo areas. The Chairman is also authorized to pledge ten percent of the cost of construction, provided, it does not exceed \$7,100 and to furnish labor when available.

The resolution was adopted on March 1, 1961 by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (b) and (k) of the Tribe's Constitution. Under Section 1 (k) the resolution will be subject to the approval of the Secretary of the Interior. I recommend that it receive favorable action.

Dear Mr. Hawley:

This is with reference to White Mountain Apache Tribal Resolution No. 61-21. This resolution authorizes the Chairman of the Tribal Council to negotiate a contract with the Public Health Service for construction of water and sewerage facilities at Cibecue and Carrizo.

The Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe authorizes the Tribal Council to make and perform contracts and agreements of every description subject to review or approval of the Secretary of the Interior where such review or approval is required by statute or regulation. I know of no statute or regulation requiring that such a contract be approved or reviewed; therefore, this resolution does not need any action by this office.

Public Health funds for this work are included in their 1962 budget and the work will not start prior to July 1 of this year. Funds to finance this contract should have been included in your 1962 budget approved by Resolution No. 61-39. It is recommended that the Tribe pass a resolution amending Resolution No. 61-39 and appropriating \$7,100 to cover this contract.

Resolution No. 61-21 was adopted by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council on May 23, 1961 pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V Section I (i) and (k) of the Amended Constitution.

This Resolution appropriates \$7,100 from Tribal funds on deposit in the United States Treasury as the Tribe's contribution toward water and sewage facilities at Cibecue and Carrizo Districts being provided under U. S. Public Health Service Contract.

This Resolution constitutes an amendment to the Tribe's annual operating budget for Fiscal Year 1962 approved by Resolution No. 61-39. As an amendment to the annual operating budget under Article V Section I (i) and (k) of the Amended Constitution, this Resolution is subject to approval by the Secretary of the Interior.

I recommend approval as submitted.
