

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED that C. E. Wyman of Eagar, Arizona be authorized to construct a sawmill for the salvage of dead timber at the abandoned cinder pit near the Reservation boundary and north of the Big Lake Road in Section 18, T. 7N., R. 27E. The Construction and operation of this mill will be in conformance with Bureau and Tribal regulations.

The foregoing resolution was on March 29, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Dear Mr. Haverland:

Tribal Resolution No. 61-31 resolves that C. E. Wyman be authorized to construct a sawmill in a cinder pit in an area commonly known as Big Cienega. This sawmill will salvage dead timber in what is known as the Coulter logging area.

The resolution was adopted on March 29, 1961 by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Tribe's Constitution. Under this authority the resolution is not subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior.
