

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe gained possession of the Vivian Rolland house at Carrizo under provisions of agreement of Tribal Revolving Credit Loan No. CF 238 and has caused same to be appraised for sale, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe came into possession of the Francis Ivins property, Whiteriver, Arizona, by voluntary surrender and has caused said property to be appraised, and

WHEREAS, said Ivins property is in such state of repair that it would not attract a buyer.


BE IT RESOLVED that the Agency Credit Officer offer the Rolland-Carrizo property for sale and apply proceeds to the delinquent Revolving Credit Loan Account of Vivian Rolland (deceased).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that repairs in the amount of \$800.00 be made, on the tribal residence formally the Ivins property, from local Tribal Building Maintenance Funds.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Agency Credit Officer is authorized, upon completion of repairs, to offer the former Ivins property for sale at a price that will enable the Tribe to make complete recovery of the loan balance plus cost of repairs and that the proceeds of sale in the amount of the delinquent loan be applied on the loan account with any remaining balance being deposited to the Tribe's Building Maintenance Account.

The foregoing resolution was on March 30, 1961, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (h) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Dear Mr. Haverland:

The Vivian Rolland house located on Upper Carrizo Creek was built with Revolving Credit funds and repayments have been in default for several years. The Tribe has repossessed this house and has it up for resale and the price will be based on an appraisal.

The house formerly owned by Francis Ivins was voluntarily surrendered and will be sold within the near future. Because of the fact that the Francis Ivins house is in such a bad state of repair it was decided that the Tribe would make repairs in the amount of \$800 to be paid from local tribal building maintenance funds. Upon completion of repair the Agency Credit Officer is authorized to offer the Francis Ivins property for sale at a price which will enable the Tribe to make recovery of the loan balance plus repair costs.

Resolution No. 61-34 was adopted on March 30, 1961 by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (h) and (i) of the Tribe's Constitution. Under this authority the resolution is not subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior.
