

Resolution No. 61-40

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 60-61, traders on the reservation were required to survey the lands being occupied by them and to delineate on the survey map of buildings and structures, and

WHEREAS, the traders were never notified of this resolution.

BE IT RESOLVED that all traders and other persons occupying lands of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation be required to furnish to the Tribe a legal description of the areas occupied by them.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said traders delineate on the survey the type of buildings or structures located within the described areas.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the survey giving the legal description be certified by a registered surveyor.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this survey and description be furnished to the Tribal Office on or before the 10th day of August, 1961.

The foregoing resolution was on May 3, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article X of Ordinance No. 32 enacted by the Tribal Council on September 3, 1959 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior as of the 10th day of September, 1959.

Dear Mr. Haverland:

Resolution No. 61-40 was adopted on May 3, 1961 by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in Article X of Ordinance No. 32 enacted by the Tribal Council on September 3, 1957 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior September 10, 1957.

In a regular Council meeting in August, 1960 Resolution No. 60-61 was passed by the Tribal Council, however, the tribal office neglected to send this resolution to Indian traders on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation. This resolution required the traders to survey the lands being occupied by them and to delineate on a survey map buildings and structures being used by said traders.

Resolution No. 61-40 resolves that all traders and other persons occupying lands on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation furnish the Tribe a legal description of the areas occupied and to submit survey maps and also give the legal descriptions, which is to be certified by a registered surveyor. It further resolves that this survey and description be furnished to the tribal office on or before the 10th day of August, 1961.
