


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there has been interest shown in the purchase of dead timber on the Becker
Creek Salvage Unit, and

WHEREAS, it is economically feasible to sell said timber.

BE IT RESOLVED that the dead timber on the Becker Creek Salvage Unit be appraised
and advertised for bids in accordance with regulations.

The foregoing resolution was on June 16, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and
0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to
authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and
By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary
of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934
(48 Stat. 984).
