

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal rolls need to be brought up to date, and

WHEREAS, the Board Regents of the Universities and State College of Arizona, acting for and on behalf of the University of Arizona has submitted a contract to perform said work, and


WHEREAS, the University of Arizona has secured matching funds from the Biometry Branch of the National Cancer Institute to help defray the costs of preparing said rolls.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe be and is hereby authorized to execute for and on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe a contract wherein, among other things, the said University of Arizona will prepare a population register, genealogical records, and information from the social and economic status of members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said contract shall provide for the payment of four thousand dollars (\$4,000.00) plus an overhead charge of fifteen percent (15%) on all expenditures for the preparation of said register.

The foregoing resolution was on June 16, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

**Dear Mr. Haverland:**

Resolution No. 61-59 approves the contract between the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the Board of Regents of the University and State College of Arizona. The purpose of the contract is to prepare a population registry and family histories for the White Mountain Apache Tribe. This resolution resolves that the Chairman be authorized to execute said contract for and on behalf of the Tribe. The resolution further resolves that the Tribe pay the University of Arizona \$4,000 plus an overhead charge of 15%.

Barry DeRose, Tribal Attorney for the White Mountain Apache's, took exception to the contract prepared by the Bureau of Ethnic Research and on June 28 recommended that Resolution No. 61-59 be rescinded. This resolution was adopted by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Tribe's constitution. Under the above-mentioned authority the Tribe may negotiate, make and perform contracts and agreements of every description not inconsistent with law or their constitution.
