

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the tribe maintains a truck and driver for, among other things, hauls wood and other supplies for certain members of the tribe, and

WHEREAS, in the past a fee of fifteen cents (.15) per travel mile has been charged persons hiring said truck and driver.

BE IT RESOLVED that hereafter a minimum haulage rate of two dollars (\$2.00) shall hereby be established for all hauls within a two-mile radius of the Post Office at Whiteriver, Arizona.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the sum of fifteen cents (.15) per travel mile be charged for any hauling in excess of the said two-mile radius.

The foregoing resolution was on June 16, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Dear Mr. Haverland:

Resolution No. 61-63 was enacted on June 16, 1961 by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Tribe's constitution. This resolution does not require review and approval by the Secretary of the Interior.

The resolution resolves that a minimum charge of \$2 be established for all hauls within a two-mile radius of the Post Office at White-river, Arizona. The resolution further resolves that the sum of fifteen cents per mile be charged for any hauling beyond the two-mile radius.
