

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe by Resolution No. 61-65 adopted by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe on June 28, 1961 authorizes the filing of an application and agreement for a loan of \$500,000 to the Fort Apache Timber Company, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to begin construction at the earliest possible date.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency and the Area Director, Phoenix Area Office are hereby requested to order the Agency Credit Officer and necessary Area staff members to proceed to the Central Office, Washington, D. C. for the purpose of presenting and reviewing all documents covering the loan application.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Lester Oliver, Tribal Chairman, is directed to accompany Bureau personnel on this mission.

The foregoing resolution was on June 28, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Dear Mr. Haverland:

Resolution No. 61-66 was adopted by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council on June 28, 1961 pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) and (1) of the Amended Constitution.

This Resolution requests that the Superintendent and the Area Director detail members of their respective staffs to proceed to the Central Office for the purpose of presenting and reviewing the loan application and agreement in connection with the proposed new sawmill. The resolution further provides that the Tribal Chairman accompany this delegation.

If the Central Office personnel concerned can be available Monday, July 10, I would recommend that our delegates be there on that date.

Under the provisions of Article V, Section 1 (a) and (1) of the Amended Constitution, this resolution is not subject to rescission.
