

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Cedar Creek Livestock Association has requested and authorized Lester Oliver, Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, to execute all documents necessary to effectuate settlement of a certain insurance claim due to a fire loss of the Stockman's residence in Cedar Creek, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concurs in the Cedar Creek Livestock Association's decision.

BE IT RESOLVED that Lester Oliver, Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, be authorized to execute any and all documents for and on behalf of the Cedar Creek Board of Directors to effectuate payment of the sum of Five Thousand Three Hundred Sixty Four Dollars and Ninety-five cents (\$5,364.95).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the settlement of the fire loss for the sum of Five Thousand Three Hundred Sixty Four Dollars and Ninety-five cents (\$5,364.95) is approved and the said Chairman is authorized to receive the said sum in full settlement of the Cedar Creek Livestock Fire loss.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Dear Mr. Haverland:

During the month of June, the stockman's quarters belonging to the Cedar Creek Livestock Association was destroyed by fire. This Association participates in the Tribe's over all insurance coverage program, and Resolution No. 61-75 authorizes the Chairman to execute any and all documents for and on behalf of the Cedar Creek Livestock Association Board of Directors. It further resolves that the sum of \$5,364.95 be accepted by the Chairman as settlement for the fire loss.

The resolution was enacted on August 2, 1961 by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Tribe's Constitution. Since this resolution is not inconsistent with law or the Tribe's Constitution, it is not subject to review or approval by the Secretary of the Interior.
