RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there are mature stands of timber in the Canyon Creek Area of Survey Unit No. 1 in need of harvesting.

BE IT RESOLVED, that a logging unit be prepared according to regulations for advertisement and bids in Survey Unit, No. 1 and that the Chairman and Secretary be authorized to sign contracts covering sales of timber in said survey unit.

The foregoing resolution was on August 3, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Resolution No. 61-84 resolves that a logging unit be prepared in Survey Unit No. 1 and that the Chairman and Secretary be authorized to sign for and on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe. This unit is located in the Canyon Creek area and in the extreme northwest corner of the Fort Apache Reservation.

The resolution was enacted on August 3, 1961 by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Tribe's Constitution. Under this authority the resolution is not subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior.
