

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Luther H. Lyles, on August 21, 1961 plead guilty to the contributing to the delinquency of a minor, and

WHEREAS, Henry Richardson, on August 21, 1961 plead guilty to the contributing to the delinquency of a minor and aggravated assault, and

WHEREAS, the said crimes were committed within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED that the said Luther H. Lyles and Henry Richardson be forcibly ejected from the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Southwest Forest Industries, Inc., be requested to discharge them from its employ.

The foregoing resolution was on September 6, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in Chapter 6, Section 2, of the Law and Order Code of the Tribe, adopted by the Tribal Council on June 23, 1941 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on June 24, 1941.

Resolution No. 61-96 resolves that Luther H. Lyles and Henry Richardson be ejected from the Fort Apache Indian Reservation. It further resolves that the Southwest Forest Industries, Inc. be requested to discharge them from its employ. Mr. Lyles and Mr. Richardson both plead guilty to the contributing to the delinquency of a White Mountain Apache minor and also aggravated assault. These crimes were committed within the Fort Apache Reservation.

Resolution No. 61-96 was enacted on September 6, 1961 by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in Chapter 6, Section 2, of the Law and Order Code of the Tribe approved by the Secretary of the Interior on June 24, 1961.
