

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribe has requested a loan from the United States in the sum of \$4,000,000.00 for construction of a sawmill, for a home building loan fund and for Recreation Enterprise Projects, and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has requested the Tribe to designate its desired priorities of the above programs.

BE IT RESOLVED that the following priorities are requested: Fort Apache Timber Company, first priority; Home Building Loan, second priority and the Recreation Enterprise, third priority.

The foregoing resolution was on November 1, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Resolution No. 61-100 was adopted on November 1, 1961 by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Tribe's Constitution. Under this authority the resolution is not subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior.

The resolution confirms the priorities in connection with the \$4,000,000 loan requested from the United States Government. The priorities are as follows:

First Priority	-	Fort Apache Timber Company
Second Priority	-	Home Building Loan
Third Priority	-	Recreation Enterprise
