

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Terry Penrod is a constant violator of the Tribal Game Laws and the State Game Regulations, and
- WHEREAS, Luther Stingley in August of this year was arrested at McNary and charged with Assault and Battery and Disturbing the Peace, found guilty, paid a fine of \$250.00 and served 30 days in jail, and
- WHEREAS, Jean Stingley, wife of Luther Stingley, was charged with a Concealed Weapon and was fined \$100.00, and
- WHEREAS, Robert (Bobby) Tobin was found guilty of the crime of Assault with a Deadly Weapon and Disturbing the Peace, was sentence 30 days in jail and fined \$250.00, and
- WHEREAS, Willie Acker was fired from his job approximately a year ago and since that time has been a general nuisance with his constant drinking at McNary and he further has no home but stays mostly in different family's homes in McNary, and
- WHEREAS, Mack Holloman was recently arrested for supplying liquor to minor Indian girls and was released and later arrested for reckless driving with liquor involved and had a young Indian girl with him, found guilty and sentenced to serve 60 days in jail and paid a fine of \$100.00.
- WHEREAS, all of the men have been discharged from the Southwest Forest Industries, Inc., unemployed and living at McNary, and
- WHEREAS, all of the men and Jean Stingley are undesirable and a menace to the reservation residents.
- BE IT RESOLVED that Terry Penrod, Luther Stingley, Jean Stingley, Robert (Bobby) Tobin, Willie Acker and Mack Holloman be forcibly evicted from the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and forever estopped from returning thereto.

The foregoing resolution was on November 2, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Chapter 6, Section 2 of the Law and Order Code of the Tribe, adopted by the Tribal Council on June 23, 1941 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on June 24, 1941.

Dear Mr. Haverland:

Resolution No. 61-105 resolves that Terry Penrod, Luther and Jean Stingley, Robert (Bobby) Tobin, Willie Acker and Mack Holloman be evicted from the Fort Apache Reservation.

Terry Penrod has constantly violated the Tribal Game Laws and the State Game Regulations while residing at McNary, Arizona and employed by the Southwest Forest Industries, Inc.

Luther Stingley was arrested in August, 1961 at McNary and charged with assault and battery and disturbing the peace and subsequently received a fine of \$250 and served 30 days in jail. His wife, Jean, was charged with carrying a concealed weapon and fined \$100.

Robert (Bobby) Tobin was found guilty of assault with a deadly weapon and disturbing the peace and was sentenced to 30 days in jail and fined \$250.

Willie Acker was fired from his job by Southwest Forest Industries, Inc. approximately a year ago but has continued to reside in McNary. He has constantly been in trouble because of his drinking and disorderly conduct.

Max Holloman is also a resident of McNary and was recently arrested for supplying intoxicating liquor to young Indian girls. He was released and later arrested for reckless driving with liquor involved and had a young Indian girl with him. He was found guilty by the Justice of the Peace and sentenced to 60 days in jail and paid a fine of \$100.

These crimes were all committed within the exterior boundaries of the Fort Apache Reservation. The men have all been discharged by Southwest Forest Industries, Inc., but continue to reside in McNary.

The resolution was adopted on November 2, 1961 by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council pursuant to authority vested in Chapter 6, Section 2 of the Law and Order Code which was approved by the Secretary of the Interior on June 24, 1941.
