

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Alfred Burdette, a San Carlos Apache Indian, has lived on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for the past fifteen years, and

WHEREAS, Alfred Burdette has done outstanding humanitarian work for the White Mountain Apache people, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe desires to show their appreciation for this exemplary work.

BE IT RESOLVED that Alfred Burdette is hereby granted Tribal Hunting and Fishing privileges for so long as he remains an actual resident of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on November 1, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Dear Mr. Haverland:

Alfred Burdette, a San Carlos Apache Indian, has resided on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for approximately fifteen years. He has been employed as an interpreter at the East Fork Lutheran Mission and has done outstanding humanitarian work among the White Mountain Apache people. The White Mountain Apache Tribal Council in order to show their appreciation granted Mr. Burdette hunting and fishing privileges for as long as he remains an actual resident of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation. This resolution does not grant Mr. Burdette the privilege of bringing guests to hunt and fish on the Fort Apache Reservation.

Resolution No. 61-107 was adopted on November 1, 1961 by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Tribe's Constitution. Under this authority the resolution is not subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior.
