

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there are matured stands of timber in the Becker Creek No. 1 Salvage Logging Unit and in the McKay No. 2 Logging Unit, and

WHEREAS, the Area Director evaluated the prices of the timber logged thereon.

BE IT RESOLVED that the following minimum appraised prices for advertisement as recommended by the Area Director be approved to-wit:

Becker Creek No. 1 Salvage Logging Unit
Dead Timber, all species, 1.00 per M.B.F.

McKay No. 2 Logging Unit.
Douglas fir \$5.00 per M.B.F.
White Fir 3.00 per M.B.F.
Spruce 5.50 per M.B.F.
Ponderosa Pine 10.50 per M.B.F.
Mexican White Pine 10:50 per M.B.F.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary of the Tribe be authorized to sign for and on behalf of the Tribe the contracts for the sale of the said timber.

The foregoing resolution was on November 2, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Dear Mr. Haverland:

Resolution No. 61-109 approves minimum appraisal prices for timber in the Becker Creek No. 1 Salvage Logging Unit and on the McKay No. 2 Logging Unit.
