

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council is desirous of aiding the Surgeon General of the Public Health Service in providing a safe water supply and adequate sanitary facilities to the residents of the Carrizo Community, Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the residents of the Carrizo Community have elected a committee composed of the following residents of Carrizo; Marcus Foster, Chairman, Violet Zospah, William Childs, and alternate Mrs. Alexander Truax, to negotiate with representatives of the Public Health Service concerning the provisions of the Carrizo domestic water and sanitation facilities project, which is being instituted under the provisions of Public Law 86-121.

BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council hereby grants approval and permission to the aforementioned committee of residents of Carrizo to enter into agreement with the Public Health Service as related to the proposed sanitation project.

The foregoing resolution was on November 2, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Resolution No. 61-111 appoints a committee of four and one alternate to negotiate with the U. S. Public Health Service for the construction of a water supply and sanitary facilities in the Carrizo Community. The resolution also authorizes the committee to enter into an agreement with the Public Health Service as related to the proposed sanitation projects.

The resolution was adopted on November 2, 1961 by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Tribe's Constitution. Under this authority the resolution is not subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior.
