

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Internal Security System of the new Tribal Business Office requires that the Tribal Treasurer be stopped from signing any time sheet or voucher for which he must also sign a check in payment therefore, and

WHEREAS, in the past, the Tribal Treasurer has performed the duties as timekeeper for various employees who lacked a regularly appointed timekeeper, and

WHEREAS, the Chairman of the General Livestock Board of Directors is a duly appointed supervisory official for the Livestock Associations.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman of the General Livestock Board of Directors shall hereafter be the designated timekeeper for all persons employed by the said Board or employed by the Council when said person's duties appertain to the Livestock Industry.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Herd Enterprise is in no way affected by this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on November 2, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Dear Mr. Haverland:

The Tribal Business Office has moved to the quarters attached to the tribal office building under the immediate supervision of the Tribal Treasurer. The Tribal General Livestock Office is located in the same building and the Board Chairman will always be available to sign time sheets and vouchers. This will relieve the Tribal Treasurer from signing time sheets and vouchers for which he must also sign checks. The last paragraph resolves that the Tribal Herd Enterprise will not be affected.

Resolution No. 61-11⁵ was adopted on November 2, 1961 by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Tribe's Constitution. Under this authority the resolution is not subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior.
