

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribe and the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife have for years operated the Williams Creek Fish Hatchery under a Fishery Management and Fish Stocking Agreement, and

WHEREAS, both parties desire to again enter into a similar agreement for a period of two years.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman be authorized to execute the Agreement between the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, Department of the Interior and the White Mountain Apache Tribe, which agreement in its entirety was read to the Tribal Council by the Superintendent, said agreement to become effective as of the 7th day of December, 1961.

The foregoing resolution was on December 7, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Dear Mr. Haverland:

Resolution No. 61-120 authorizes the Tribe to enter into an agreement for fishery management and fish stocking. This agreement is for a period of two years. The resolution also authorizes the Tribal Chairman to execute an agreement between the Sport Fisheries and Wildlife of the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

This resolution was adopted pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Tribe's Constitution. Under this authority the Tribe may negotiate, make and perform contracts not inconsistent with law or the Tribe's Constitution. It is not subject to review or approval of the Secretary of the Interior nor is it inconsistent with any law or the Constitution.
