


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, for a number of months the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been negotiating with United States of America by and through the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife and Wildlife Service, Department of the Interior covering certain lands of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation commonly known as the Williams Creek Fish Hatchery, and

WHEREAS, the said Bureau of Sport Fisheries and the Tribe have reached an agreement.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribe agrees to enter into the said lease provided, however, that the agreement in its final draft is first read to the Tribal Council for approval.

The foregoing resolution was on December 7, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Dear Mr. Haverland:

During the past year we have been negotiating with the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife for the leasing of lands on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation now occupied by the Williams Creek Fish Hatchery. We have finally reached an agreement and Resolution No. 61-121 resolves that the Tribe may enter into a lease agreement provided that the agreement in its final draft be first read to the Tribal Council for approval.

The District Office of the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife at Albuquerque, New Mexico is drawing up the agreement and will be forwarded to the Tribe for review during its regular meeting on January 3, 1962.

Resolution No. 61-121 was duly adopted by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council pursuant to authority vested in Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Tribe's Constitution. Under this authority the resolution is not subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior.
