

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, inclement weather has forced the termination of logging in the high country, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that sawed logs be furnished the tribal planing mill.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary be authorized to sign logging and milling contracts for 1962, covering Fort Apache Wholesale Lumber Company operations in the Tribal Sawmill Block.

The foregoing resolution was on December 7, 1961 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
