

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is now in the process of constructing a new sawmill under the name and style of Fort Apache Timber Company; and

WHEREAS, funds are needed to construct approximately $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles of road leading to the said sawmill; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe desires to construct said road by Bureau of Indian Affairs Force Account.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Tribal Funds on deposit with the U. S. Treasury in the amount of \$22,000.00 are hereby authorized, appropriated and advanced for the construction of the said road by the Bureau of Indian Affairs under its Force Account Method.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that that T.R. No. 61-39 be amended accordingly and the sum of \$22,000.00 be added to Section IX - New Construction, (f), and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon completion of said road, the said Fort Apache Timber Company repay the said sum of \$22,000.00 to the Tribe without interest.

The foregoing resolution was on January 3, 1962 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
