WHEREAS, the Arizona State Highway Department has made appropriation for a right-of-way 1300' in length, beginning at Highway Engineer's Station 716 + 50 and ending at Highway Engineer's Station 740400, U. S. Highway 60, Gila County, Arizona, and


WHEREAS, the Tribe will benefit by the improvement of said road,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a right-of-way 1300' in length, beginning at Highway Engineer's Station 716 + 50 and ending at Highway Engineer's Station 740400, U. S. Highway 60, Gila County, Arizona, which highway is more particularly described and delineated on the Arizona Highway Department Globe-Show Low Highway right-of-way Map, Project NON F-026-1-502, which Map is on file in the office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation to which reference is hereby made, is hereby granted to the State of Arizona.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED tha the Highway Department be required to construct and maintain all fences where needed along said right-of-way.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Council be authorized to sign any and all documents necessary to effectuate said right-of-way.

The foregoing resolution was on January 3, 1962 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
