

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, under the Macdonald Feasibility Study for the construction of the Fort Apache Timber Company Sawmill, no funds were provided for the paving of the lumber drying area, and

WHEREAS, the soil at the site is of such an absorbent nature that the gravel placed thereon would sink into the soil below and be lost.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman and Secretary are hereby authorized and directed to request an additional loan from the Bureau of Indian Affairs in the amount of \$70,020.00 to provide for pavement of the lumber drying area of the proposed sawmill.

The foregoing resolution was on February 7, 1962 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
