

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, S.1479 provides for the assumption by the various states of civil or criminal jurisdiction over cases arising on Indian reservations with the consent of the Tribe involved and further permits gradual transfer of such jurisdiction to the states; and

WHEREAS, such legislation is needed and would be of great benefit to the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Tribal Council unanimously endorses S.1479.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the entire Arizona delegation.

The foregoing resolution was on May 2, 1962, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
