

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Father Sebastian Dzielski has requested the issuance of a patent in fee for a one ~~acre~~ plot of ground located on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

WHEREAS, said acre of ground has been used and occupied as a Catholic Mission for a number of years.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that consent is hereby given by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to the Secretary of the Interior to issue a fee patent to the St. Francis Mission of the Roman Catholic Church to the following described ground located on the Fort Apache Reservation, Navajo County, Arizona:

Beginning at the northwest corner of the Government garage, thence 78 degrees 30' W. 139 ft. to northeast corner of site, Corner #1; thence South 13 degrees 00' W. 264 ft. to Corner #2; thence North 77 degrees 00' East 165 ft. to Corner #3; thence North 13 degrees 00' East 264 ft. to Corner #4; thence South 77 degrees 00' West 165 ft. to Corner #1, enclosing 1 acre; from Corner #4, the N.E. corner of Guard House lies N. 77 degrees 00' E. 252 ft. 4 in.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said patent shall provide that when said land is no longer used for mission or school purposes, it shall revert to the United States of America in trust for the White Mountain Apache Tribe as are all other trust lands within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a survey shall be made of the above described area to assure that the above description accurately describes the land involved.

The foregoing resolution was on May 3, 1962, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (e) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
