


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, there are no industrial plants located in the Cibecue area, and
- WHEREAS, most of the workers in the Cibecue area are unemployed and in dire circumstances, and
- WHEREAS, the residents of the Cibecue area have been canvassed relative to either having bus service to Carrizo to work in the sawmill or as to their desire to have a sawmill located in the Cibecue area, and
- WHEREAS, a great majority of those interviewed declared their wish that the sawmill be located in Cibecue.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency establish a logging unit in the western block and lumber be manufactured in the sawmill located in the Cibecue District.

The foregoing resolution was on June 6, 1962 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
