

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Western States Telephone Company, Inc., with office and principal place of business at Holbrook, Arizona, has requested a right of way for a telephone line 20 feet in width and 5.703 miles in length across Indian trust lands of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Apache County, Arizona, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe will benefit by the construction of said telephone lines from McNary to the Williams Creek Fish Hatchery.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a right of way 20 feet in width and 5.703 miles in length, as described and delineated on Map No. 1, which is on file in the office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency, is hereby granted to the Western States Telephone Company, Inc., and that the Chairman of the Council be authorized to sign any and all documents necessary to effectuate said right of way.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all damages be waived as the Tribe will benefit by the construction of the telephone line.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1962, duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
