

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Paschal Johnson and his wife, Alutha Johnson have applied for a homesite lease in the vicinity of Seven Mile, and

WHEREAS, they have submitted a rough sketch of the tract of land upon which they wish to build a house, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has no objection to the use of this tract of land for a homesite for Mr. & Mrs. Johnson.

BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe do hereby approve and grant a homesite lease for a period of 10 years with a renewal option of 10 years at a rate of \$12.00 per annum payable in advance on the 1st day of October, 1962, with an annual payment of a like amount on the same date each year thereafter in accordance with the terms of the lease, for as long as the lease should run.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman is hereby authorized to execute the lease, for and on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on September 5, 1962, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (n) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
