

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has a game management program, part of which is control of rodents and predatory animals, and

WHEREAS, said rodents and predatory animal control program to be effective requires the dissemination of the 1080 poison in certain areas of the reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED that the United States Department of the Interior, Fish and Wildlife Service, Bureau of Sports Fisheries and Wildlife is hereby authorized to place on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for control of predatory animals and rodents 1080 poison for the fiscal year of 1962-63.

The foregoing resolution was on September 5, 1962, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe, June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
