

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Timber Company, a Tribal Enterprise, has made application for a road right-of-way, 1.067 miles in length and 100 feet in width, from the new tribal sawmill to Route 46 (East Fork Road), and

WHEREAS, the Tribe will benefit by the construction of said road.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a road right-of-way, 1.067 miles in length and 100 feet in width, which road is more particularly described and delineated on the "Right-of-Way Map - Sawmill Access Road" submitted by the Phoenix Area Office, which map is on file in the office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation to which reference is hereby made, is hereby granted to the Fort Apache Timber Company.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Fort Apache Timber Company be required to construct and maintain all fences where needed along said right-of-way.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all damages be waived and that the Chairman of the Council be authorized to sign any and all documents necessary to effectuate said right-of-way.

The foregoing resolution was on September 6, 1962, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
