

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Albert H. Hawley has been the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency for many years, and

WHEREAS, Albert M. Hawley is being elevated to a new position off the reservation.

WHEREAS, because of his leadership many of the Indian Tribes in the United States are attempting to emulate the White Mountain Apaches, and

WHEREAS, the Council in a small way desires to express its appreciation for his keen interest in the Tribe's welfare.

BE IT RESOLVED that Mr. Albert M. Hawley is hereby authorized to keep his horse at the I. D. Ranch on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, during his absence, at no charge.

The foregoing resolution was on October 30, 1962 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
