

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Branch of Land Operations of the Bureau of Indian Affairs is removing juniper, oak and other chaparral species from the Cibecue Drainage for the purpose of improving the rangeland, and

WHEREAS, the various species of oak and juniper is burned as waste material, and


WHEREAS, Mr. Robert Neal of Mesa, Arizona has conducted a successful charcoal business on the San Carlos Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Neal and the Chief of Land Operations for the Fort Apache Indian Agency conducted a survey of the chaining area and have agreed that there is enough wood to start the charcoal operation.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Mr. Robert Neal is hereby authorized to cooperate with the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency to salvage waste wood for charcoal purposes in the Cibecue area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Tribal Council and the Chairman be authorized to sign for and on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe any and all documents necessary to effectuate an agreement between the White Mountain Apache Tribe and Mr. Robert Neal.

The foregoing resolution was on November 7, 1962 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
