

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, H. L. Barnett is now and has been harvesting oak to be used for converter poles and railroad ties, and

WHEREAS, the said oak and other species on certain areas of the reservation could be harvested to be used in the manufacture of charcoal, and

WHEREAS, said species are not now being utilized, and

WHEREAS, it is economically feasible to the White Mountain Apache Tribe to harvest said oak and other species.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Forester of the Fort Apache Indian Agency prepare for advertisement and sale designated areas of oak, juniper and other species used in the manufacture of charcoal.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and the Secretary are authorized to enter into a charcoal sales agreement covering said species, the quantity and prices to be paid therefor to be ascertained by the Bureau.

The foregoing resolution was on December 5, 1962 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
