

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Construction and Maintenance Enterprise lacks the operating capital necessary to efficiently operate the construction and maintenance program, and

WHEREAS, the Construction Manager of the Tribal Construction Enterprise has obligated the Tribe in the amount of approximately \$86,000.00, said sum having been used as and for working capital in order for the said Construction Manager to bid and construct projects and to train Apache workers, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been informed that the Construction Program has not only benefited the economic resources of the Tribe but also the human resources, and

WHEREAS, a sum of \$25,000.00 had been previously budgeted by the Tribe for bonding purposes only.

BE IT RESOLVED that a sum not to exceed \$86,000.00 is hereby appropriated from tribal funds to cover any expenditures for the Construction and Maintenance Program incurred by the Manager and which the Tribe is morally obligated to pay.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the sum of \$25,000.00 previously appropriated for the construction program as and for bonding purposes may now be used as and for working capital by the Construction Manager.

The foregoing resolution was on April 4, 1963 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
